It's housed outside the library in the north hallway cabinet and includes classics by Alan Watts, Joseph Campbell, and Mathew Fox, among others.

Kids' Corner

Need more variety in your child's weekly digest? A selection of children's and young adult books are available for young readers in a section of the library specifically set aside for their interests. It includes picture books for those who liked to be read to, too!
